The minutes of the previous meeting were read. Mr. Nesbitt moved they be approved as read. Seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

Mr. Nesbitt moved that W. Ray Converse be appointed Town Attorney for the Town of Palmyra for the year 1958, seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

Mr. Baran moved that Francis O. Tcole be appointed Town Constable of the Town of Palmyra for the year 1958 and that in lieu of salary he retain for his services rendered the statutory fee, plus mileage of 15¢ per mile, seconded by Mr. Nesbitt. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

Mr. Pierce moved that Mary C. Johnson be appointed Town Historian for the year 1958, seconded by Mr. Nesbitt. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

Mr. Nesbitt moved that Alfred Campbell be appointed Dog Warden for the year 1958, seconded by Mr. Baran. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

Mr. Nesbitt moved the appointment of John VanHall as Chairman of the Board of Assessors, seconded by Mr. Pierce. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

Clerk advised the Board that she would like to have Harold E. Jeffery and Harry E. Young as her deputies for 1958.

Mr. Nesbitt moved that Harold E. Jeffery be appointed as deputy town clerk with all the powers of the town clerk and that Harry E. Young with power to issue conservation and dog licenses only and that Mr. Young be compensated \$6.00 for each days work in this office, but not to exceed the amount set in the budget. Seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

Mr. Baran moved that the town officers be paid 8 cents per mile for the use of their automobile for each mile actually and necessarily traveled by them in the performance of their duties of their office. Seconded by Mr. Pierce. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

Mr. Nesbitt moved that the salaries of the Supervisor, Justices, Town Councilmen, Town Clerk, Town Highway Superintendent, Town Attorney be set as advertised. Seconded by Mr. Pierce. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

Mr. Baran moved that the salaries of the town assessors as follows: Chairman of the Board - \$900, the other two at \$650 each. Seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

Mr. Nesbitt moved that the salary of the tax collector be \$800 for year 1958, Town Historian - \$200.00. Seconded by Mr. Pierce. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

Mr. Nesbitt moved that the Election Inspectors receive \$15.00 per day for the First Registration Day and Election Day and \$12.00 for the second Registration Day and Primary Day. Seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

Mr. Baran moved that the Caretakers of the Cemeteries be set at \$1.25 per hour not to exceed amount set in budget. Seconded by Mr. Nesbitt. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

Mr. Baran moved that the salary of the Registrar be set at \$100.00 per year. Seconded by Mr. Nesbitt. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

Mr. Nesbitt moved that the official newspaper for the Town of Palmyra for the year 1958 be designated as the Palmyra Courier Co., Inc. Seconded by Mr. Baran. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

Mr. Baran moved that the purchase price of gravel purchased within the town be set at 15¢ per yard for bank-run gravel. Seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

WHEREAS, under the provision of Article 12 of the Town Law of the State of New York, this Board is charged with the responsibility of establishing and extending special improvement districts, and

WHEREAS, it appears from the foregoing Article that where there exists a special improvement district, this Board is obligated by law to extend the special improvement to all owners' property adjacent to an accepted town public highway, and

WHEREAS, this Board has experienced in the past that the cost of such extensions places an inequitable and unjust tax burden on those other residents of the special improvement district not specifically benefited by such extensions, and

WHEREAS, it is the considered judgment of this Board that it would be to the benefit of the citizens of the Town of Palmyra to eliminate such unjust tax burdens which arise by reason of the cost of such extensions,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that it shall be the policy of the Town board of the Town of Palmyra, to require that prior to the acceptance of this Board of any streets or highways of a dedication from any developers or sub-dividers of housing tracts which are located within an existing special improvement district, this Board shall require that the special improvements which this Board is obligated by law to provide shall be completely furnished and paid for by the said developers and sub-dividers to the extent that the cost thereof shall not create any added expense to those other residents of the special improvement districts not directly benefited thereby.

Mr. Pierce moved that the above resolution be tabled, seconded by Mr. Baran. Ayes 5, noes 0. Carried.

Whereas, the Town Superintendent of Highways did on the 9th day of January, 1958, duly recommend the purchase of a tractor shovel pursuant to the provisions of Section 142 of the Highway Law,

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved that pursuant to Section 142 of the Highway Law the Town Superintendent of Highways is hereby authorized to purchase, in accordance with the provisions of Article 5-a of the General Municipal Law, with the approval of the County Superintendent of Highways, the following: ONE MODEL HU HOUGH PAYLOADER TRACTOR SHOVEL, for a maximum price of Thirteen thousand one hundred sixty-five dollars delivered at Palmyra, N. Y. on or about March 15th, 1958.

The Town Superintendent of Highways is hereby authorized, subject to the approval of the County Superintendent of Highways to surrender to the Vendor one used HAH Payloader as part payment for the above machinery to be purchased.

Following is Contract between the Village and Town:

This Agreement, made and executed in duplicate this 20th day of February, 1958, by and between the Village of Palmyra, a municipal corporation, and the Town of Palmyra, a municipal corporation, both located within the County of Wayne and State of New York,

Witnesseth:

Whereas, the Village of Palmyra is now the owner of a certain parcel of land located on the Guernesey Road in the Town of Palmyra, and which said premises serve as a public dump or dumping ground, owned and under the control of the Village of Palmyra, and

Whereas, this dumping ground has been used by both the residents of the Town of Palmyra and the Village of Palmyra in the past by reason of an agreement between the Town of Palmyra and the Village of Palmyra dated May 17, 1955, the term of which extended for a period of two (2) years, and the parties being mutually desirous of continuing to have a common dumping ground,

Now, Therefore, in consideration of the sum of \$100.00 to be paid by the Town of Palmyra to the Village of Palmyra upon the delivery and the sealing of this agreement by the parties hereto, receipt thereof which is hereby acknowledge, the Village of Palmyra hereby grants to the Town of Palmyra permission to use said public dumping ground for itself and the residents of the Town of Palmyra, for a period of one (1) year from the date hereof, excluding that portion of the dumping ground presently set aside for the dumping of industrial waste of The Garlock Packing Company of the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, said dumping ground to be used in accordance with regulations heretofore duly established for operation and use thereof.

In Witness Whereof, this agreement has been executed by the Village of Palmyra, pursuant to a resolution authorizing same duly adopted by the Board of Trustees of said Village on the 20th day of January, 1958, and by the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra on the 20th day of February, 1958.
