Minutes of the previous meeting approved as read.

(purchase truck tires) Mr. Pierce moved that James DeBrine be authorized to purchase two 1000-20 truck tires and one 1400-24 used tire for the grader, seconded by Mr. Nesbitt. Ayes 5, Noos 0. Carried.

(increase of hwy. employees 10¢ per hr.) Mr. O'Meal moved that the six highway employees be given a 10¢ an hr. increase, effective January 16, 1954, seconded by Mr. Baran. Ayes 5, Noos 0. Carried.

(Hearing on purchase of truck) The Supervisor announced that a hearing had been called for at this time regarding the purchase of new 1954 3½T dump truck and that all persons interested would be heard at this time.

Clerk presented and read proof of hearing.

No persons having appeared, Mr. Pierce moved that the hearing be closed. Seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Ayes 5, Noos 0. Carried.

Resolution purchase of truck The following resolution offered by Mr. O'Meal, who moved its adoption and seconded by Mr. Nesbitt:

Whereas, the Town Superintendent of Highways did on the 10th day of December, 1953, duly recommend the purchase of a certain equipment pursuant to the provisions of Section 142 of Highway Law, and a notice of such recommendation has been duly published as provided in such section.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that pursuant to Section 142 of the Highway Law the Town Superintendent of Highways is hereby authorized to purchase from U.W. Sherburne, Inc. with the approval of the County Superintendent of Highways: One new 1954 3½ town Ford truck, 144" WB chassis and cab, Auburn DHD-40 Body for a total price of Seven Thousand Four Hundred Six Dollars and Seventy-five cents (\$7,406.75).

Terms of payment will be as follows:

Check drawn on Machinery Fund \$7,406.75

The supervisor announced the resolution carried by a vote of five ayes and no nays.

Clerk advised the Board that she would like to have Harold Jeffery and Harry Young serve as her deputies for 1954. Mr. Pierce moved that Harold Jeffery be appointed as deputy clerk with all powers of the town

clerk and that Mr. Young be limited to that of issuing conservation and dog licenses only and that Mr. Young be compensated \$6.00 for each day of work in this office, (not to exceed the amount in budget). Seconded by Mr. Nesbitt. Ayes 5, Noos 0. Carried.

Salaries of town officers Mr. Fierce moved that the salaries of the elective and appointee officers be as follows: Supervisor, \$2300; Justices, \$800.00 each; Councilmen, \$300.00 each; Town Clerk, \$2300; Highway Supt, \$4500.00; Assessors \$850.00 chairman, \$600.00 for other two; Welfare Officer, \$1700.00; Historian, \$200.00; Tax Collector, \$800.00; Registrar \$100.00. Seconded by Mr. Nesbitt. Ayes 5, Noos 0. Carried.

Mileage Mr. O'Meal moved that the town officers be paid 8 cents per mile for the use of their automobiles for each mile actually and necessarily traveled by them in the performance of their duties of their office. Seconded by Mr. Baran. Ayes 5, Noos 0. Carried.

Community Center Project Whereas, it is the intention of the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra to establish a Community Center Project and Whereas the Town of Palmyra is about to submit an application for such a project to the New York State Youth Commission for its approval, and if approved, to apply subsequently to the State of New York for partial reimbursement of funds expended on said project, as provided by Chapter 556 of the Laws of 1945, as amended; now, therefore, be it Resolved that such application is in all respects approved and Sherwood W. Mate, Supervisor is hereby directed and authorized to duly execute and to present said application of the New York State Youth Commission for its approval. 





At this time Mr. Sheffield, chairman of the Zoning Committee, appeared before the Board with the following report from the zoning committee:

To the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra:

The undersigned members of the Zoning Committee of the Town of Palmyra, appointed by the Town Board at its meeting on June 10, 1954, respectfully submits this report of its findings and recommendations.

The Committee having met on August 31 and Sept. 8, 1954 and having conferred with a competent consultant in zoning matter, personally inspected the existing land use in certain areas of the Town and examined pertinent literature on the subject of zoning, and having discussed the subject in open meeting, makes the following findings:

1. There presently exists in some areas of the Town (outside the limits of the Village of Palmyra) cases of private land use which constitute or may become detrimental to the health, safety or general welfare of the community.

2. As the lands of the Town are further developed and improved in the future there is a likelihood, judging from the experience of other communities, that such cases will multiply, and thereby adversely affect real property values and create serious public health and safety hazards.

3. To meet such conditions in the interest of the community as a whole, it is desirable that the Town avail itself of the authority and powers relating to zoning and planning provided in Article 16 of the Town Law for the purpose of conserving the value of buildings and land improvements and encouraging the most appropriate use of land throughout the Town, such purpose to be accomplished however with a minimum of necessary regulations.

Accordingly, the Committee recommends:

1. that the town board appoint a zoning commission pursuant to section 266 of the Town Law to prepare and submit to the Board in accordance with the procedure established by law a report of its recommendations of the zoning districts of the Town (outside the limits of the Village of Palmyra) and appropriate regulations to be enforced therein.

2. That, following the enactment of a zoning ordinance, if such action is taken, the Town Board further appoint a Planning Board as provided in section 271 of the Town Law and that the Town Board then consider empowering such planning board to approve plats and subdivisions pursuant to section 276, and to exercise such other powers provided by law as the Town Board shall deem appropriate.






