Mr. Converse having been requested to obtain determination of rights of Mr. Haak and Mr. Williamson in regard to their continuation to sell the 16 building lots within the water district was stated by Mr. Converse. The conclusion being that the Town Board has no absolute duty to construct a lateral in a Water District upon demand and a mandamus proceeding will not lie to compel it to do so.

Following is the legal opinion to Town Attorney cited in full:

About the year 1951 a Water District was formed in the Town of Palmyra called "Maple Avenue Water District". This district extended along Maple Avenue, north of Palmyra, and included therein all of the area within a line 500 feet east of and parallel with the center line of Maple Avenue and a line 500 feet west of and parallel with the center line of Maple Avenue. All of the territory lies north of the canal.

Water for the District has been supplied by the Village of Palmyra from a main which leads out to Division Street, the next street east of and practically parallel with Maple Avenue. This main is laid on the bridge across the canal. There is no water main extending northerly from the Village along the street or highway leading directly into Maple Avenue.

Many new dwellings have been built along Maple Avenue and the water pressure already is dangerously low. The Engineer for the Town informs us that the present facilities will not take care of any more.

Two individuals have purchased a tract of land east of the property line of the dwellings on the east side of Maple Avenue and now propose to open up a street and construct sixteen houses all within the Maple Avenue Water District. They agree to comply with all the requirements of the Town Board as to highways, laying water lines, etc.

These developers say in effect "we are within the water district and therefore have as much right to water for our new homes as any other resident of the district"; this in spite of the fact that there will not be enough water available to adequately supply anyone in the district if the additional load is permitted.

The Town Board has requested my opinion as to whether it has an absolute duty to serve additional dwellings should they be constructed.

Sec. 199 of the Town Law provides for the construction of lateral water pipes in water districts. The proceedings are initiated by a petition in the manner therein provided. The Town Board calls a public

hearing to be held after due notice and from the evidence given thereat decides whether it is in the public interest to make the improvement.

This determination is judicial in nature. Mandamus will not lie to compel a town board to construct a lateral in a Water District 8 Op State Comptroller 183, 1952. Town Board has no absolute duty to construct a lateral in a Water District upon demand 8 Op State Comptroller 331, 1952.

As the Comptroller says "certainly, if, after the filing of a petition and the holding of a public hearing the Town Board is required to determine that the project is in the public interest and required to grant the relief asked in the petition, then the proceeding is a farce and of no significance".

CONCLUSIONS

The Town Board has no absolute duty to construct a lateral in a Water upon demand and a mandamus proceeding will not lie to compel it to do so.

Mr. Converse explained to them that if it is their desire to initiate a hearing that he would get in touch with their Attorney, Mr. Nesbitt and prepare petition to the Town Board.

REQUEST TO PLACE TRAILER ON CANANDAIGUA RD DENIED

Mr. Francis Rush appeared before the Board in regard to placing a trailer on his property on the Canandaigua Road. The Town Board advised him that they were very sorry but there are no variances cited in the trailer ordinance and that they would have to deny him this request.

DECISION OF WATER R.COMM APPROVING APPL. DIVISION ST.

Town Attorney filed the Decision of Water Resources Commission approving the application of the Division Street Water District with the Town Board. Mr. Pierce moved the adoption of the following resolution:

*Proposed to be approved by the Board on 1/30/62*

WHEREAS under date of November 22, 1961, K.G.Woodward & Associates furnished the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra with a proposal and agreement to furnish engineering services for the construction of water mains for the Maple Avenue Water District and for the Division Street Water District, and

WHEREAS, plans for additions to the facilities of the Maple Avenue Water District as originally contemplated have been temporarily discontinued and the Town Board of the Town of Palmyra desires to proceed with the construction of the Division Street Water District project and has deleted from the "Proposal" and the agreement reference to the Maple Avenue Water District.

Now, Therefore, be it resolved that the agreement annexed to the "proposal" (with reference to the Maple Avenue Water District deleted) be executed on behalf of the Town of Palmyra by its Supervisor, Sherwood W. Mate.

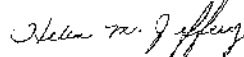

The minutes of the previous meeting were read.  
Mr. O'Meal moved that they be approved as read. Seconded by Mr. White. Ayes 4, nos 0. Carried.

Letter from Mr. Cole presented and read relative to his interest in selling the parcel of land consisting of about 6 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres fronting on Kent Street to the Town of Palmyra for \$2250.

Highway Superintendent reported that he now is ready to sell it for \$2000.

Mr. Pierce moved that we take the necessary steps to buy this property for \$2000. Seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Ayes 4, nos 0. Carried.

Mr. Pierce moved that James D. Bramer be appointed Town Health Officer for a term of 4 years. Seconded by Mr. O'Meal. Ayes 4, nos 0. Carried.

Mr. Mate reported that he has received the approval from the N.Y. S. Division for Youth for partial reimbursement of funds.

Petition for the formation of a water district from residents on the North Creek Road to the Blackburn property, Marion Road to the Van Ritten property and Walker Road to the Burn property was presented and read.

Mr. O'Meal moved that this be taken up with the Engineer, Mr. Woodward to obtain an estimated cost for such a project and also to obtain from the Assessors the assessment in this area whereby a tax rate could be worked out and inform the people of the possible cost and tax rate. Seconded by Mr. White. Ayes 4, nos 0. Carried.

At this time Mr. LeMoyné, Chairman of the Town Planning Board appeared before the Board and stated that they are now about completed with the first portion of the contract and presented two proposals. The proposal will complete the planning study, town's obligation will be \$4,486.50 or \$2,243.25 yearly payment. The second proposal will carry the program up to and including a zoning ordinance, the town's obligation would be \$3,465 or yearly obligation of \$1,732.50. He also stated that the adoption of the subdivision regulations has been held up until the Town Planning Board has had a decision from the Town Attorney as to whether or not the Planning Board shall have jurisdiction over re-subdivision, when obtained it can then be submitted for Town Board's approval.

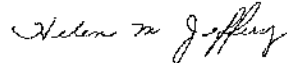

Section 4. It is hereby determined the object or purpose for which such Serial Bonds are to be issued falls within Subparagraph 1 of Subdivision A of Section II of the Local Finance Law and that the period of probable usefulness of such object or purpose is 40 years.
